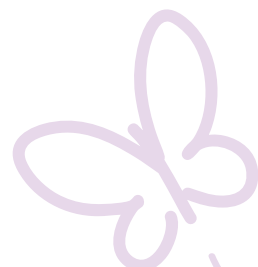

# President's Report 2025

## A Spectacular 40th Year

2025 was a landmark 40th year for the Women's Centre for Change, reflecting four decades of impact – major milestones, record-breaking fundraising, expanded services, and strengthened advocacy. WCC continued steadfast in supporting victims and raising awareness on gender-based violence across communities.



Our Anniversary Fundraising Dinner on 24 August 2025 welcomed over 700 guests and raised more than RM700,000 – surpassing our RM500,000 target and marking our most successful fundraising effort to date. The WCC Charity Art Exhibition Sale in April featured over 70 donated artworks, showcasing how creativity can inspire generosity and support a meaningful cause.

A major milestone was securing a permanent home for WCC Value Shop after eight years. The newly acquired, larger space ensures long-term stability while providing a more comfortable shopping experience, supported by dedicated supervisors, volunteers and continuous public donations. We also launched a new corporate video highlighting WCC's work, featuring our staff and volunteers.

Amid celebrations, our core work – with details in the following pages – remained unwavering:

- Our service teams provided counselling to 629 new clients, handled 964 hotline calls, and supported 286 hospital-referred cases
- Advocacy staff supported 85 court cases and expanded training initiatives in Johor and Kedah
- Our outreach school programmes reached over 9,500 students, while public talks, promotional booths, and digital campaigns significantly broadened awareness on gender-based violence and access to support

Guided by our vision and mission, we remain committed to creating lasting change and empowering women, children and communities to be free from violence.

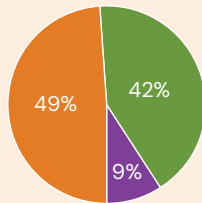
In 2025, both WCC Island and PPW in Seberang Prai, continued providing counselling and crisis intervention services for women and children affected by domestic and sexual violence and family distress. Service demand remained high across both offices, despite WCC Island team going through staffing transitions and operational constraints. Here are highlights of our services in 2025:

## Service 2025



### Face-to-Face Counselling

629 new clients | 70 former clients | 405 follow-up sessions



Types of cases (new clients):

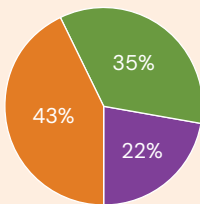

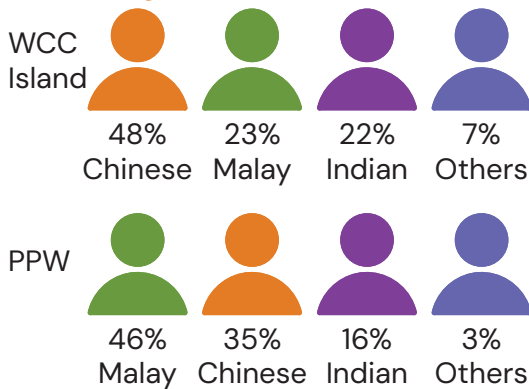

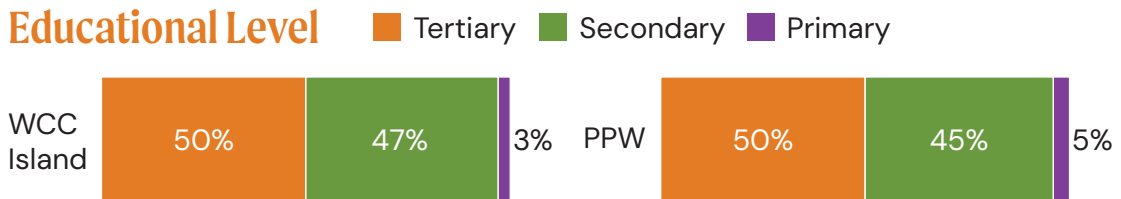

Most of WCC Island's clients were Chinese (48%), and PPW's Malay (46%). PPW also saw an increase of Indian clients after a Tamil-speaking social worker came on board. Half of the clients had tertiary education, and nearly half had up to secondary education.

## Client's Story

# Here's how WCC made a difference for a client facing domestic violence.

Munah\* is a working professional and a mother of three. Her husband is a management agent. Throughout their marriage, Munah experienced persistent emotional, financial, and sexual abuse, as well as stringent social control.

Unable to endure her husband's abusive behavior further, Munah filed a police report and initiated divorce proceedings in the Syariah Court. She eventually withdrew the report after her husband pleaded for forgiveness and promised to change.

But the situation did not improve; instead, his behaviour became increasingly controlling and oppressive. She was coerced into surrendering her entire salary to her husband, receiving only a meagre monthly allowance of RM200. Munah was saddled with significant debts incurred in her name for loans taken by her husband. She was also frequently subjected to non-consensual sexual acts, while her husband strictly monitored her movements and communications.

The prolonged stress caused a severe decline in Munah's mental health, leading to suicidal ideation and thoughts of harming her children. She felt utterly trapped.

The situation reached a critical point when her husband brandished a knife at Munah and the children, leaving them in absolute fear for their safety.

Following this crisis, Munah's mother contacted WCC for help. Recognising that Munah was under extreme surveillance with her mobile phone strictly monitored by her husband, WCC was able to communicate directly with Munah's employer to bypass the perpetrator's control and provide confidential counselling sessions for her. Our social worker helped Munah with her safety plans and provided her with legal information. By helping her to explore her options and understand her rights, WCC empowered Munah to proceed with legal action. Munah decided to lodge a fresh police report.

Eventually, Munah's husband was charged in court. He pleaded guilty and was sentenced to two months' imprisonment and a fine of RM2,000. Munah expressed profound relief at the verdict, which has finally provided her with the safety to escape the violence and the space to rebuild her life with her children.

## Trainings, Talks & Meetings

In 2025, WCC and PPW reached over 900 participants through various trainings, talks and meetings. Highlights included:

### OSCC and Health Clinic Talks & Trainings

We conducted six talks reaching 294 medical personnel, and delivered six OSCC and health clinic training sessions benefitting 242 medical personnel —reaching a total of 536 medical personnel to improve their understanding of gender-based violence and victim-centred interventions.

### Inter-agency Meetings

Inter-agency meetings were held three times with 182 government representatives to strengthen multi-agency coordination.

### Kita Chill, Kita Heal Workshop Series

This new four-session workshop series for teenage girls, preceded by a parent engagement session, brought together 16 participants aged 12–16 to learn about self-identity, healthy relationships, cybersafety, and future planning.

### Safe Family Policy Workshops & Other Community Talks

We conducted two Safe Family Policy training workshops for 50 grassroots leaders to improve their understanding on domestic violence, Muslim women's rights, and appropriate community responses. We also conducted four additional community talks reaching 121 participants on family wellbeing, safety, and self-awareness.





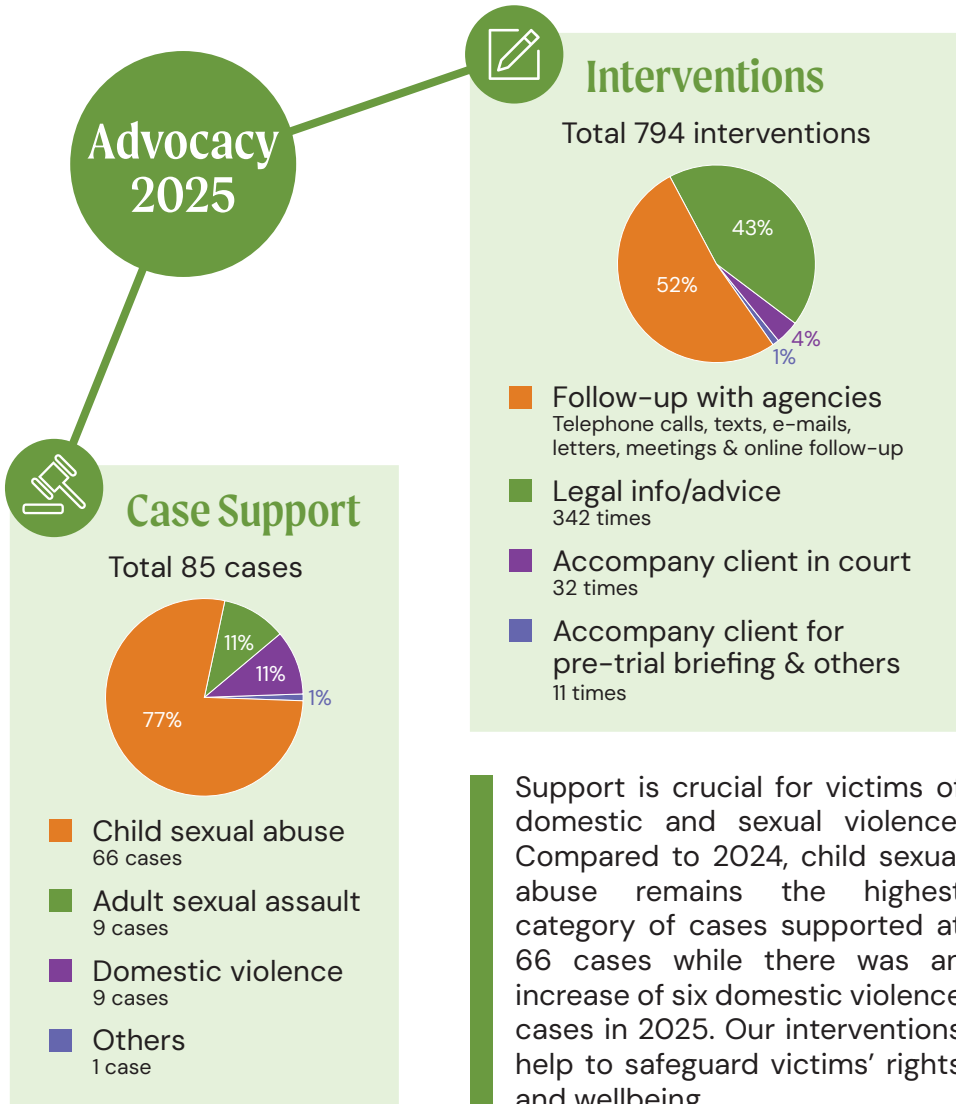

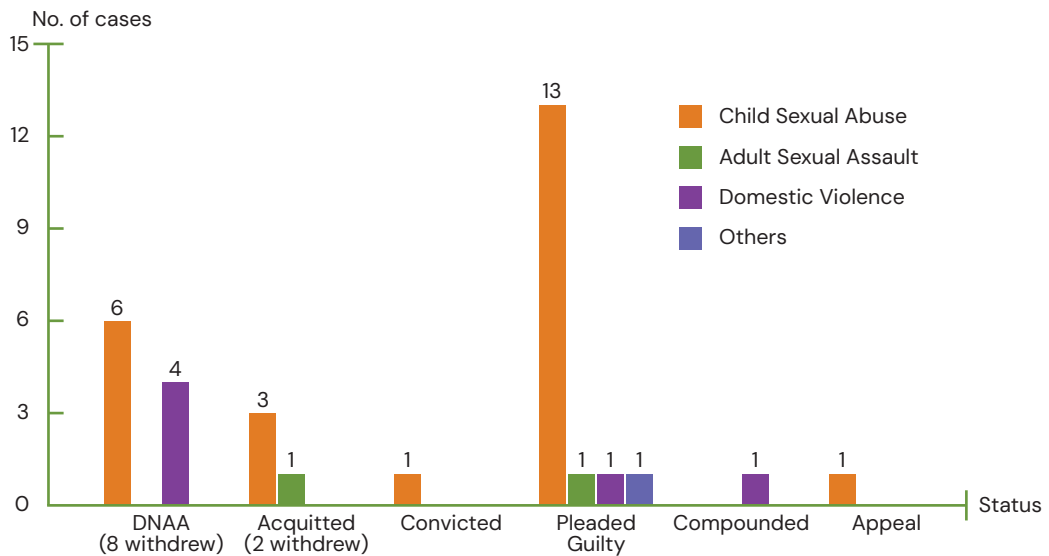
# Advocacy 2025

In 2025, the Advocacy team upheld our focus on supporting victims' access to justice and strengthening protections for women and children. The team handled 85 court cases, providing legal guidance, court accompaniment, and coordination with justice agencies. Here's an overview of our work supporting victims and improving access to justice:



## Status of Court Cases Supported in 2025



In addition to the above, there were a total of 52 ongoing court cases that we supported: 42 child sexual abuse, 7 adult sexual assault, and 3 domestic violence cases. Notably, there were 10 Discharge Not Amounting to Acquittal (DNAA) cases, primarily due to victims withdrawing their cases in four child sexual abuse cases and four domestic violence cases.

## Highlights of Court Trials Observed

We supported 16 clients, including 12 child victims of sexual abuse, in five Penang courts. Positive developments were observed in the court trials:



However, we noted that nearly half (47%) of trials were postponed for various reasons, causing delay in access to justice for victims.

## Improving Protections for Women & Children

WCC organised two multi-agency training workshops and a seminar in Johor and Kedah, enriching over 90 participants' knowledge and skills on handling child sexual crimes as well as interagency collaboration among police, hospitals, the social welfare department, prosecutors and courts. These activities, funded by the Canada Fund for Local Initiatives (CFLI), were very well received.

The Kedah seminar was WCC's first multi-agency initiative to address child sexual crimes in Kedah.

Key observations included:

- Higher percentage of boy victims
- Identification of district hotspots
- High Discharge Not Amounting to Acquittal (DNAA) rate in courts

# Creating Resources with Nationwide Impact

With CFLI sponsorship, WCC updated our *Surviving Court* booklets in English and Malay, incorporating the latest legal developments. The booklets were printed and distributed to clients, criminal justice agencies, and other stakeholders.



WCC also produced a short awareness film, *Pandai Anak Murid Cikgu* (Good Boy) in collaboration with Monyads Studio and Freedom Film Network and supported by CFLI. It tells the story of Zak, a secondary school boy who is groomed and sexually abused by his teacher, and aims to raise public awareness that sexual abuse can also happen to boys. Achieving over 30,000 views, the film was featured in *The Star* and *Sin Chew*.

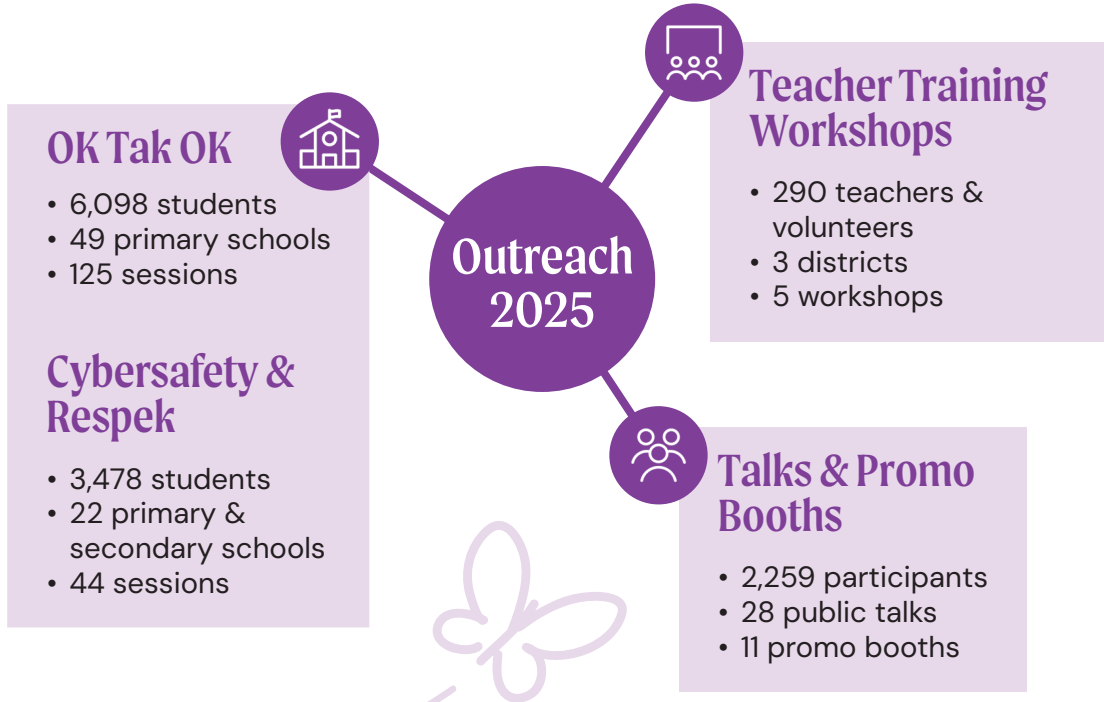

# Outreach 2025

WCC remains committed to safeguarding and empowering children, with a strong focus on preventing sexual abuse and online exploitation through school-based programmes, community outreach, and public education initiatives. Here's a snapshot of our community outreach work in 2025:





## OK Tak OK

WCC's flagship child sexual abuse prevention programme, OK Tak OK, has been running for nearly three decades, equipping primary school children with the knowledge to identify inappropriate touches and to seek help from trusted adults. In response to the increasing cases of online grooming, the programme was expanded to include online safety education, teaching children to protect themselves from digital exploitation. We were encouraged that, through our previous teacher training sessions and word of mouth, more national schools have proactively invited WCC to conduct these programmes.



## Cybersafety & Respek

With widespread internet access, young people today are increasingly exposed to risks such as online grooming, sexting, explicit content, and other forms of digital harm. As children and teenagers spend increasing amounts of time online, many remain unaware of the risks they face, including manipulation, exploitation, and cyber violence. WCC's Cybersafety and Respek programmes aim to strengthen young people's understanding of respect, empathy, and responsible digital behaviour so they can make safer and more informed choices.

## Teacher Training Workshops

Building on earlier efforts, WCC continued to equip educators with the knowledge and practical skills to address online exploitation, with the long-term goal of reaching primary schools across Penang. WCC conducted three online violence prevention workshops which focused on helping teachers understand child development, emerging online trends, and ways to keep children safe online, including expert input from an adolescent health specialist. Additional sessions strengthened teachers' capacity to handle child sexual abuse cases, while in-house training prepared volunteers to deliver WCC's school programmes.





## Public Talks & Promotional Booths

WCC continued to receive invitations from communities and institutions to deliver public talks on topics related to gender-based violence, women’s rights, and gender equality. To enhance visibility within local communities and expand our networks with diverse stakeholders, we set up promotional booths to engage children, educators, parents, and local organisations to increase public awareness on women’s and children’s issues while highlighting WCC’s services and programmes. We incorporated interactive, family-friendly activities and games to encourage active participation.



# Communications 2025

## Social Media & The Press

Masya Zabidi, Choong Yong Yi, Karen Lai & Loh Cheng Kooi

Guided by our mission to end violence against women and children, we actively utilise social and mainstream media to raise awareness and advocate for action. By sharing key messages in multiple languages, we drive meaningful change among diverse communities.



In 2025, we produced 128 multi-lingual online posters and reels, reaching 507,700 social media users nationwide

In July 2025, we issued a press statement pushing for action against a doctor who allegedly sexually harassed his female patients; 10 newspapers covered us. The doctor was subsequently charged in court.

Throughout the year, we were also featured eight times in the national media, highlighting women's and children's issues.

# WCC Value Shop

## Shop with Purpose, Donate to Support

The WCC Value Shop, established in late 2017, is a social enterprise supporting WCC's mission to end violence against women and children. Selling pre-loved items donated by the public, WCC Value Shop channels its proceeds to support WCC's important work while promoting the 3Rs - reduce, reuse, recycle.

In 2025, an important milestone was achieved when WCC Value Shop acquired our own home - a neighbouring shoplot at Island 88, doubling the size of our earlier premises. This sustainable investment enabled the generation of more proceeds to support WCC's work, while offering shoppers a more comfortable, conducive and enjoyable experience.



WCC Value Shop is open six days a week (closed on Wednesdays). In 2025, we held two successful sales events and introduced a new initiative in October, a Bundle Sale, selling clothing at only RM10 per kilo. This event gave 2,500 clothing items a second life while greatly reducing our excess stock. Overall, we received positive customer feedback and mobilised more volunteers to support our activities.



## Our Success Factors

### Dedicated Team & Volunteers

Committed supervisors and volunteers, including those from MNCs, ensure success of day-to-day operations and sales.

### Active Social Media Promotion

In 2025, 79 reels were produced reaching 224,899 views (up from 135,315 in 2024), boosting visibility and impact.

Generous donors consistently contribute quality pre-loved items, trusting WCC to manage them responsibly.

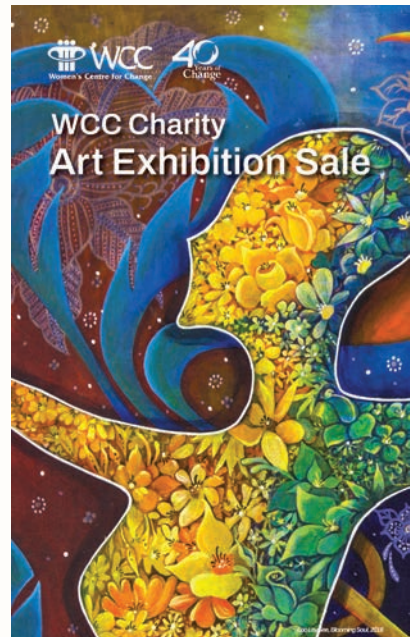
